*\*Please note: Children must have completed Kindergarten to participate in this camp.*

### Smolt Camp \* Ages 9-12

A deeper exploration of Alaskan nature through lessons, games, and activities focusing on natural history and natural science.

### Adopt A Stream Camp \* Ages 9-12

Featuring all of the fun from our famous Adopt A Stream school program wrapped into one week of water testing, insect hunting, and watershed exploration.
